

Appeal for Fired Officer Christopher Manney Pushed to March - By Bill Glauber of the Journal Sentinel - Feb. 6, 2015

The disciplinary appeal of former police officer Christopher Manney was pushed back to March, the Milwaukee police and Fire Commission announced Friday.

The appeal was scheduled for Feb. 27 but there was a joint request for adjournment filed by the attorneys in the case.

Manney was fired after the fatal shooting of Dontre Hamilton in Red Arrow Park. Milwaukee police Chief Edward Flynn fired Manney in October for the officer's actions leading up to the shooting.

In December, Milwaukee County District Attorney John Chisholm deemed the shooting justifiable self-defense, meaning no state criminal charges will be filed in the case.

Flynn announces firing of officer in Red Arrow Park shooting

The Milwaukee police officer who fatally shot Dontre Hamilton at Red Arrow Park has been fired because he did not follow department procedures for dealing with emotionally disturbed people, Chief Edward Flynn announced Wednesday.
