In November 2017 Mary Lainberger and I attended UMW training on facilitating unit conversations about A Way Forward provided by UMW National staff from New York. It was part of our Leadership Development Day training for new Conference Officers. These conversations are an effort to expand knowledge about A Way Forward and to enable United Methodist Women to have their voices heard by our General Conference Delegates. Our delegates will be acting on the report from The Commission on A Way Forward and the Council of Bishops' recommendations at the Special General Conference in February, 2019. The delegates will be voting on our worldwide church's future at General Conference in 2020. In the last few months I have been part of a Bible Study where we have been studying the book of Esther. It brought me back to the Leadership Conference a few years ago where we also studied that book. One favorite verse is Esther 4:14: "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" Esther became the queen and was able to make a difference in the lives of her people, the Jews. Her husband the King had signed an edict that would wipe out all Jews (realize that he did not know she was Jewish). Esther's uncle Mordecai had asked her to speak to the King. She was fearful as the law was that if you approached the king without having an appointment with him, (even if you were married to him), you would be put to death. It was understandable then that she was hesitant. But her uncle suggested to her that she had been precisely and explicitly placed in the court, at that particular point in time, in order to be able to do exactly that – to talk to the King. She realized that to be true and chose to spoke up and approach the King. The King welcomed her in and God used her to save the Jews from a genocide.

I am guessing that some of us have had a similar experience. God used us at the right time (for such a time as this). A few things have just taken place in my life. We leave for California today for spring break and will be helping my mother decide what she should get rid of/keep for her move to Wisconsin this summer. Well, last night my son shared some not so good news about his ill father-in-law in Minneapolis, who may not have too long to live. My daughter-in-law had to quickly book a flight from LA to Minneapolis. It just so happens that we are able to pick her up today at 2:30 as we fly out tonight and let her use our car while we are gone. Coincidence? Some may say so, but we Christians know that these things happen "for such as time as this!" God's timing is amazing. Then this morning another event took place. Please realize that I had just prayed that God would give me something to write about for this devotion which was due today. Boy, did God answer this prayer. So, my friend Michelle helps run Feed My People. She was excited to talk to me this morning at 5:45 AM when we run/walk together. She wanted to tell me something because she knows that I have been praying about starting a food bank in our church. It just so happened that Michelle learned yesterday that because of some recent events, they want to help our church financially start a food bank! That was an obstacle for us (did you know that to run a food bank, the church has to buy the food to give away?). Now the funding will be provided. Whoo hoo! For such a time as this. You can't make this stuff up. God provides. If we wait on God, God comes to us "for such a time as this." Check out the book of Esther. It is very cool and be ready for God to work in your life at just the right time – for such a time as this.
