



President's Message: Hello, all!

I'd like to use this President's message to share some updates from the National United Women in Faith that came recently to conference presidents. It concerns the Member Dashboard (portal) on the United Women in Faith website that we hoped would launch in early May. The launch has now been delayed to later in May for technical reasons discovered in the final round of testing.

The Member Dashboard will be the "go-to" source of information for members. It will feature news, a weekly inspiring word, weekly member and national highlights and stories, updates, and events accessible to members only. It will host the most current information for all members regarding the Inspire, Influence and Impact tracks and calls to actions.

The website has been a tool for individuals to connect with United Women in Faith through the All Access Membership option. Now, United Women in Faith is also releasing a new All Access Group Application that offers a new way for members and units to organize. Members and units of churches that are disaffiliating or going inactive can remain connected to the mission and work of United Women in Faith.

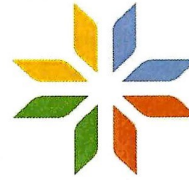

Spiritual Growth Message from Linda Caprariello

“Boldness in Prayer!”

Matthew 6:5-14 gives us a short tutorial from Jesus, on “Prayer,” concluding with the words of The Lord’s Prayer. Verses 6-8 gives us some instructions:

“But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.”

Luke 11:1 reminds us that when Jesus was praying in a certain place, one of his disciples said to him, ***“Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.”*** It becomes very clear, that Jesus’ chosen disciples needed to learn how to pray, and as Jesus’ followers and United Women in Faith, so do we! Sometimes, we just need that basic tutorial, or perhaps, in all our years of loving and following God, we just need to learn how to be **BOLDER** in our prayers!

How exciting then, to look forward – To come to Mission u and dig into and explore the *Lord’s Prayer as a Spiritual Practice for Social Transformation!* This prayer was how Jesus taught his disciples, and how he seeks to teach us, as his followers!

But for now, let us reflect on how we might learn to pray with more **boldness!** The dictionary says that ***“boldness implies that one will not hesitate or be fearful in the face of actual or possible danger or rebuff; courageous and daring.”***

I found myself being more **bold** this week...I let go of my fear to ask for prayers for my sister who has been in the hospital for two weeks now. She has been suffering from numerous complications, after collapsing and being rushed to the ER for an emergency surgery of an unsuspected perforated ulcer! She has lived with chronic pain for the past 20 years from Arachnoiditis, an inflammation of her spinal cord – such serious, daily back pain! I was so relieved that she was in the hands of great doctors and nurses, but then, there was not improvement – only more problems cropping up!

My brother and sisters were devastated—our baby sister was in serious condition! I had been praying, but, on that early morning, when I woke up and realized that fear & dread was taking over my spirit, I knew that I needed help! I needed God’s Power, and a LOT of it! But where to go? I decided to go to Face Book! Yes...It may have the reputation for “fun & games...travel and photos,” but this time, I prayed to share a **bold** message of need – for my sister and my family to get through this! I knew she would NEVER write or ask for this, but the Holy Spirit took over, and with no hesitation or fear, I reached out to share my need to friends and families from all over the U.S.

And the end of this story? God is still working in my sister’s healing and rehabilitation, and I will continue to trust in his faithfulness! But something else transpired: I myself was “rehabilitated!” I was “brought back to life” as I read and cried through SO MANY messages of love, care, support, encouragement, scripture verses, and yes...their repeated prayers! Such a time of blessed gratefulness!! Friends, may we be so **bold** to pray without fear or rebuff, but only rejoice, that our God will delight in our **boldness!**

Wisconsin SB 110/AB 114 Expand Medicaid to 12 months Postpartum

Right now this bill is both in the Governor’s budget proposal, and being heard as a standalone bill.

During the three hour Senate Committee hearing, over 25 legislators, healthcare professionals, mothers, advocacy groups, and anti-abortion activists spoke and [submitted testimony](#) in favor of passing this bill. Over [40 groups](#) have registered in favor of this bill, and not one has registered in opposition. **This type of unanimous, bipartisan support does occur in the legislature, and when it does, we should jump at the opportunity to act on behalf of the Wisconsin people. This is our moment to help postpartum moms and parents! Let’s pass this bill!**

Supporting Wisconsin families during the postpartum period is a priority—we are working to save the lives of mothers. Two-thirds of maternal deaths occur 6 to 12 months after the baby is born, and the United States is the only developed country where the maternal mortality rate has increased, doubling over the past two decades, and increasing 40% in 2021. Postpartum women deserve access to healthcare.

South East District Secretary of Program Resources, Gail Burgess, hosted the hourlong event which featured a variety of book club discussion questions as well as short videos on the “Pack Horse Librarians” and “Facts about the Blue People of Kentucky”. Most participants had already read the book — and the person who admitted to not having read it said she would read it after learning about its contents through the discussion! :-)

The purpose of this gathering is to provide a forum for discussing the books we read for the Reading Program. A book from each of the categories has been selected in hopes that those who participate will also be able to qualify for the First Level in the program! Future books include FIREKEEPER’S DAUGHTER, ON THE COME UP, THE FOUR WINDS, and WHAT IS GOD LIKE? In future years the program could be expanded to ten books (Plan 2). Who knows, maybe we can even get to watch one of the Reading Program movies?!

Treasurer’s Report of Final 2022 Financial Results

For 2022, the Wisconsin Conference United Women in Faith pledged \$185,000 toward the five channels of giving to the United Women in Faith National Office. Unfortunately, we were not able to continue our multiple-year record of exceeding our pledge, but came in only slightly under our pledge for 2022. For the year, we contributed \$181,581 for the five channels of giving plus an additional \$49,022 in designated giving.

We were helped tremendously by a very generous bequest from the Estate of Helen Bennett, which provided \$60,000 of support, split equally between the Pledge to Mission and the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund.

In addition to the pass-through donations discussed above, we received \$28,500 of Pledge to Mission funds that were kept to fund the conference and district budgets. That, along with \$2,656 of registration fees, were used to provide \$15,500 of budget support to the districts and cover \$17,840 of conference expenses. In addition to these annual expenses, the Conference provided \$5,539 in scholarships to Assembly 2022 in later 2021 through 2022.

All of this support and programming was only possible because of the generous giving from United Women in Faith across Wisconsin, so *thank you* for all your donations!

Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund Wisconsin Conference

The Mabel Heil Scholarships are made possible by earnings from a trust established in the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a resident of Cuba City, Wisconsin. Funds are awarded by the Heil Scholarship Committee of the Wisconsin Conference United Women in Faith and are invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation. Any Wisconsin United Methodist woman working to improve her education may apply.

Available Funds:

- a. Funds will be invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, in a fund split 60 percent equity and 40 percent fixed.
- b. Funds available to provide scholarships for each semester will be calculated as 2.5 percent of the fair market value of the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund as of the end of the month prior to the approval of Scholarships.

Eligibility Requirements:

- a. Must be a female member of the United Women in Faith and/or United Methodist Church, Wisconsin.
- b. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what ways do I consider myself a worthy student?"
- c. Letter of recommendation from either the president of the local UWFaith unit or from your pastor.
- d. Letter of recommendation from a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative. (Person writing letter on behalf of applicant is to send the letter directly to the contact person)
- e. All letters must be written (Preferably typed) on one side of an 8.5x11" sheet of white paper using black ink.

Application Procedures:

- a. Awarded for one semester at a time. To be considered again for any subsequent semester, send letter asking to be considered.
- b. Graduate students may apply for each semester as long as they meet the other requirements
- c. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation OR RECONSIDERATION LETTER must be received by May 1 for the fall semester or October 1 for the spring semester. Checks will be disbursed by August 15 and January 15.
