

Wisconsin Conference UMW Annual Gathering

Wisconsin United Methodist Women answered A Call to Community by attending a spirit filled Annual Gathering at First UMC Waukesha on Oct. 20-21. 30 women participated in the tour of Northcott Neighborhood House on Friday afternoon before the annual gathering. An overview of Northcott was given by Mac Weddle and Bob. A major concern for Northcott is the leaking roof over the gym. Friday evening there was District officer training and an update on Northcott was given by Adrianne Griffin. 110 United Methodist women and 5 District Superintendents (Scott Carlson, Sue D'Alessio, Forrest Wells, Deborah Thompson, and Kate Croskery Jones) participated on Saturday. Donations were collected for Harbor House and Crisis Shelters. The Limitless young women led us in our Purpose in English, Spanish, and Hmong. Presentations included the Washington Seminar, on Assembly 2018, and Legacy 150. The Seminar was held in Washington, DC and New York in August. Participants studied climate justice and income inequality at the United Methodist Building in DC and at the United Nations in New York. Barbara Dick was the key note speaker on Saturday morning. Her keynote speech, "A Call to Community" is posted on the Wisconsin UMW website at: www.wisconsinumw.org. The Milwaukee Muslim Women's Coalition was the key note speaker in the afternoon. Members of the panel were able to join us for lunch before their presentation. Continuing with the theme of A Call to Community, Janan Najeeb presented a PowerPoint presentation on building bridges, and dispelling Muslim stereotypes. A special offering was taken for the Legacy fund. \$1717.00 was received. An offering was taken for UMW misions. \$1196.00 was received. 
- 1. Contact list of your District Officers (incl. full address, phone # & email if they have one)

I wonder if your aware of a major event in the history of the church that was just commemorated: the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation, when Martin Luther nailed the famous 95 Theses on the door of the Wittenberg church on October 31, 1517. Many churches celebrated this on Sunday, October 29, also called Reformation Day. We should all be aware of the significance of this event.

A few years ago, I was visiting the Catholic Church that my daughter and her family were attending at the time. Her priest announced that it was Reformation Sunday for Protestants around the world and he felt that the church should sing *A Mighty Fortress is our God*. My husband and I were brought to tears as we belted out that great Martin Luther hymn and as priest and many in the church sang acapella and without a hymnal. I'm sure that many of you know this song but I want you to see the 2nd stanza.

Did we in our own strength confide, our striving would be losing, were not the right man on our side, the man of God's own choosing. Dost ask who that may be? Christ Jesus, it is he; Lord Sabaoth, his name, from age to age the same, and he must win the battle.

Here we see the importance of our relationship with Jesus who alone wins the battle. There is nothing we can do to earn God's favor. It is God who wins the battle.

If you were to look up Protestant Reformation on history.com it says.

The Protestant Reformation was the 16th-century religious, political, intellectual and cultural upheaval that splintered Catholic Europe, setting in place the structures and beliefs that would define the continent in the modern era. In northern and central Europe, reformers like Martin Luther, John Calvin and Henry VIII challenged papal authority and questioned the Catholic Church's ability to define Christian practice. They argued for a religious and political redistribution of power into the hands of Bible- and pamphlet-reading pastors and princes. The disruption triggered wars, persecutions and the so-called Counter-Reformation, the Catholic Church's delayed but forceful response to the Protestants.

So, what does this all mean?

I would say one of the key texts that makes it all clear to me is those two verses that many of us had to memorize — Ephesians 2: 8,9: - "For by grace are you saved by faith. And that not of yourselves is the gift of God, not of works lest anyone should boast!"

So, our salvation is all about grace (<u>G</u>od's <u>W</u>ork <u>At C</u>hrist's <u>E</u>xpense). There is nothing we can do except tell God we need God. Our works do not get us to heaven. It is all about our faith in God. Another key point is that we can have our own Bible in a language that we can read. Luther was excommunicated from the Roman Catholic Church because his emphasis was on *Sola Scriptura* – Scripture alone as the Christian's ultimate authority, as opposed to Popes or Councils. He read through the entire Bible each year for at least ten years of his life.

I hope you are encouraged like me to realize how this Reformation 500 years ago affects us today. Now that we understand how the importance of Scripture has changed, I might ask "How is your Bible reading going?" I hope we don't all take it for granted and like Luther attempt to read it through in a year!



The Mabel Heil Scholarships are a result of funds from the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a woman from Cuba City, Wisconsin. The first scholarships were granted in 1981. Since then more than 240 women have received help with their education.

Requirements and Instructions

Instructions:

- 1. Be a female member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women.
- 2. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what way do I consider myself a worthy student?"
- 3. Send the completed application form to the contact person by May 1 for the Fall semester or October 1 for the Spring semester.
- 4. Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by the president of the local United Methodist Women or the pastor of the church.
- 5. Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative.

Rules:

Any member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women working to improve her education may apply.

Please have all letters written (preferably typed) on one side of 8 1/2 by 11 sheet of white paper using black ink.

All applications are photocopied for the committee members.

Scholarships are awarded one semester at a time. To be considered again DURING a one-year period, you must send a letter asking to be considered. AFTER one year, you will need to fill out another form and secure new recommendations.

If in any given year there is an increase of applications, these priorities will be followed: Women responsible for others will be favored. Women preparing to return to the employment field will be favored.

Application and two (2) letters of recommendation must be postmarked no later than May 1 and October 1 to be considered.

Schedule:

1st Semester: Apply by May 1; notified by June 1; check sent by August 15. 2nd Semester: Apply by October 1; notified by November 1; check sent by December 1.


