What a difficult, unusual year we are experiencing. Who amongst us have ever lived during a pandemic? For many, our world has been turned upside down. Nothing in our “normal” routine is normal any more. I missed our newsletter deadline which isn’t like me. Perhaps that was a good thing for I had not received information about the process for doing our 2020 census. I usually include that in my article for our November newsletter.

Guess what? The email from our New York Office (NYO) arrived as I was writing my article so now I can share some of what I’ll be sending to district presidents and membership nurture and outreach coordinators.

*From our NYO “This year we will be changing the name of the census and testing the name “**Unit Survey**”. Over the past 5 years, the form has taken shape to be more than a number reporting tool and more of a questionnaire regarding the health and vitality of the unit. The past (3) years we have asked questions about what does it mean to be a thriving unit and what attributes do you relate to thriving. This year, we are asking the unit presidents to self-select in what area(s) their members/units are thriving. This will help influence what it means to “thrive” at the district and unit level as well as inform the national office and conference leadership on strengths and areas for improvement.”*

By the time our newsletter is in your hands I plan to forward the “**Unit Survey**” process and information to your district president and district membership nurture and outreach coordinator. It will be their task to forward it to each unit president in your district. A printable “**Unit Survey**” will be included which you can use to collect your unit’s survey answers before online data entry. We will all be available to assist you if you need help to enter your data into the computer. Please contact us for assistance.

During this very difficult, unusual time how have you reached out to your UMW sisters and friends? In the **response** magazine for November/December 2020 our General Secretary Harriett Jane Olson in her Responsively Yours, “Give Us Grateful Hearts” article shares ways we can reach out. She asks “What if we started a practice of making a call, sending a message or writing a note to someone every day between now and New Year’s Day who has made a difference in our lives?” Perhaps you’ve reached out in other ways. I’m interested in hearing from you about what you/your unit has done to stay connected and share life during the pandemic.

Thank you to all members, units, and districts for your support of UMW mission and ministries through the UMW's five channels of giving (Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition, Gift to Mission, Gift in Memory, and World Thank Offering)! Together, we are transforming the lives of children, youth, and women within Wisconsin and throughout the world!

For 2020 through November 3, 2020, the Wisconsin Conference UMW had received \$109,148 from local units and districts through all five channels of giving. This is more than \$30,000 less than had been received at the same time last year. We know that local units have been unable to have meetings and many fundraising events during the pandemic. However, some units have come up with creative variations on past fundraising events or new events that are safe even during this difficult time. These include ideas like curbside pickups of meals or holiday cookies and asking unit and/or church members to donate amounts they would have spent on or contributed to UMW events.

As we approach the end of the year, please ensure your 2020 Pledge to Mission and other giving is submitted to your district treasurer by their deadline in early December so they have time to submit the final 2020 payments to the Conference by year end.

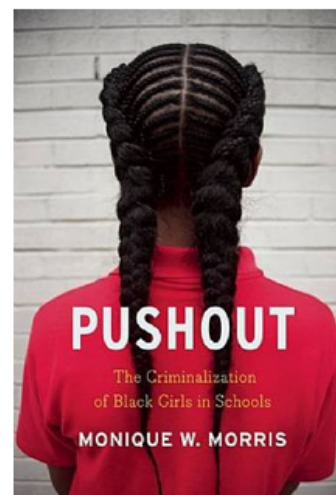
Pushout: The Criminalization of Black Girls in Schools

Education & Interpretation

This is the time of year, Fall, when we focus on World Thank Offering, one of our five channels of Mission giving. World Thank Offering is spontaneous gifts given out of gratitude for God's abundance and is usually collected by local units in a special service of thanksgiving. These gifts are usually used for mission in the United States and around the world. The year 2020 has been a difficult year filled with anxiety and uncertainty, not only for us here in the United States but for countries all over the world.

Here in the United States, November is the month when we celebrate Thanksgiving and give thanks for God's blessings in whatever way we can. After living through eight months of covid-19 we have much for which to be thankful. In showing our gratitude, let us not forget those who have been less fortunate than we have been. United Methodist Women always share God's blessing with others, thus fulfilling the Purpose of the organization. How will you as a unit, as an individual, share your blessings with others?

Your Thank Offering supports missions for women and children throughout the United States and the world. Below are a few things for which we can be thankful. Let us recognize and appreciate the blessings that United Methodist Women bring to others.

1. – Be thankful for your home, your shelter, your safety. Many people are homeless. UMW supports centers for children and family in Anchorage, AK; Tampa, FL; Urbana, IL; LaVerne, CA; St. Louis, MO; Cedartown, GA and many others.
2. – Be thankful you can get to your doctor or the hospital in a few minutes. Many people walk miles for medical care. UMW supports the bicycle ambulance project to assist in filling a service gap to transport expectant mothers to hospital for delivery in Kasungu District, Malawi.
3. – Be thankful for food in your pantry and cupboards and access to the grocery store. Many people face starvation without gardens or access to stores. UMW supports food programs. Studies show that wealthy neighborhoods have three times as many supermarkets as poor ones do, white neighborhoods have four times as many grocery stores as predominantly black ones do and that these stores in African-American communities are usually smaller with less selection.
4. – Be thankful for employment opportunities. UMW supports Ons Plek Projects, Mission of Methodist Church of South Africa, Cape Town with purchase of computers, a UPS system, wireless projectors and software to help girls gain skills to leave the street life behind them.

5. – Be thankful for your family. The world is full of orphaned children from war and disease. UMW supports NGO Shalom Reconciliation Ministries supporting care and education of orphan and vulnerable boys and girls in Kotido, Uganda.
6. – Be thankful for the peace we can find in Wallowa County. Many wake each morning in fear for their lives. UMW supports the Methodist Church of Sri Lanka and their work with young war widows to gain education and vocational skills training.
7. – Be thankful for our freedom. Many who stand for their convictions are persecuted or imprisoned. UMW supports the Bethune House which provides shelter, health and legal services for Indonesian migrant domestic workers in crisis.
8. -- Be thankful for our farmland. As the world population grows, tillable land is lost. UMW supports Grassroots International, The Women’s Empowerment and Food Sovereignty Program in Palestine to provide training, tools, and bees for Palestine women to produce and sell honey to earn money to feed their families and communities.
9. – Be thankful for your education and our schools. Children walk miles to have the same opportunity. UMW supports Amity Foundation, Southern China University for Girls project to support girls completing full education through university.
10. – Be thankful for the bounty of our gardens and the farmers’ market. Many people have depleted soil or not water for crops. UMW supports the North Katanga Annual Conference, Democratic Republic of Congo, for crop production of rural women in Kamina district along with food security efforts and education.
- 11.– Be thankful you are not a refugee fleeing war, famine, floods and political unrest. A third of the world’s population is refugees. UMW supports the Russia United Methodist Women’s support for women in crisis at Susannah Wesley Care Center in Voronezh, Russia.
12. – Be thankful that we can express our Christian faith at Christmas. Many people are persecuted for declaring their belief in Jesus Christ. UMW supports the Hesperian Foundation to provide health information on reproductive health and chronic diseases, such as malaria, serving women, children and youth throughout Africa.

I am thankful for United Methodist Women; for all my sisters here in the United States and Worldwide.

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Program Resources

I can hardly believe that it is November already, and that December is right around the corner. What a year we have had! None of us expected to be living with covid-19 for this long, but thank God we have been able to manage. With November comes Thanksgiving and in December we look forward to Christmas and celebrating the birth of Christ. These two months also bring us much anxiety and stress and this year is not going to be the exception. We worry about how we will celebrate these major holidays. For one thing, we will not be able to celebrate these events with family the way we were accustomed to; instead, we have to be mindful of gatherings, and social distancing in order to stay healthy, and that brings us even more stress.

Are you a worrier? Do you get stressed easily? How do you cope when you are worried or stressed? Do you rely on God; on your faith? I would like to suggest one way that you may find relief in this stressful time that would help you to grow spiritually and could last you a lifetime. During the Thanksgiving/Christmas Season, I would encourage you to read the book **Finding Peace in an Anxious World**. It is one of the Bonus books on the 2021-2022 Reading Program and one that is being studied at Mission u. If you read this book during the season, for one thing, by reading now, you will also be prepared for Mission u 2021.

This book/study 'uses the book of Proverbs and the "Serenity Prayer" as a guide to help Christians find their way through anxiety, worry and fear and move toward God's peace, which surpasses all understanding'. It is a book that is very relevant, and discusses spiritual practices during anxiety. It provides help, through scriptural and spiritual disciplines, that allows one to cope with stress and anxiety and be rooted in God and be energized to live fully as disciples of Christ.

The focus in the book is on four sermons; Serenity, Acceptance, Courage and Wisdom. We all know the Serenity prayer but do we know the origin of the prayer? If you don't, that is one thing you will discover and this study will offer an enlightening experience through its four chapters. I encourage you to invite God in, cast your worry on him and give yourself over to the peace and serenity that will come.

Do you have a book? The latest issue (November/December) of Response magazine lists the 2021-2022 Reading Program and has an inset on **Where to Find Books**. You can always check your local library and I'm sure that the Librarian will be happy to find a copy for you. I wish you a Blessed and Stress-free holiday season.
