Social Action: Jean Kissack

Here is a letter from the Caring Across America Team:

The White House Conference on Aging kicks off on Monday, and organizers are still putting the finishing touches on the day's program — and ultimately their final policy proposals.

They can't afford to ignore the programs that support Americans as they age: Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid.

These programs have long enabled seniors and people with disabilities to live and age with independence and health. But as our country gets older, we face new challenges, and families can't bear the burden of caregiving alone.

The WHCOA must call for protecting and modernizing these programs so that they address the needs of today's families.

Social Security supports millions of older Americans, providing a majority of the income of more than two thirds of retirees. But for too many, it's still not enough and many seniors live in poverty, even after working hard for decades. And family members who leave work to care for a loved one lose out on future Social Security benefits.

One of the things Caring Across will propose next week is the creation of caregiver credits that treat time spent providing care family members the same as work at a job when calculating benefits.

Medicare and Medicaid are extremely successful programs that provide critical health care coverage for our nation's oldest and poorest residents, but millions of people still fall through the gaps and are left without essential coverage. Nobody should have to intentionally go into poverty to afford home care services, so we'll call for consumer asset protection in Medicaid. We'll also push for the rebalancing of Medicaid toward a greater investment in and emphasis on home and community-based services.

It's vital that the White House Conference on Aging addresses these gaps in our elder support system. Join us in demanding that protecting and modernizing Social Security,

Medicare, and Medicaid be included in the WHCOA's policy proposals.

The Hammond UMW has been removed from our local units list as they have no unit of their own and do not wish to be in with New Centerville.


The Christmas Party on Dec 5th will be at the Little Taste of Italy in Colfax, WI.


