Can I make an appointment with someone ; in my Senator's or Congressperson's office to present my concerns in person? These and many more questions will find answers on the seminar.

UNITED METHODIST WOMEN are organized for MISSION. What better places to find answers to what are our concerns and how we do that mission? I am not sure we will find out the whole answer, but part of it involves "making disciples for the transformation of the world!" What better places to be than in the thick of the action, closer to not only finding out answers, but also witnessing to outcomes.

The average temperature for Mission u this year was 77°. That is much below the normal of 98.5°. I expect that by next year we will all be healthier.
