As we wind down 2015 and look forward to 2016, are you ready with all the Mission Resource tools your local and district UMW need for the coming year? Here's a checklist for the "Sensational Six" essentials every UMW should have:

√1. United Methodist Women Handbook 2013-2016

This is our most basic resource with policies, guidelines, the Constitution & Bylaws, and resources for fulfilling our PURPOSE and Vision. We are all part of the community of United Methodist Women; the Handbook connects us. Every local UMW should have a minimum of one Handbook. The Handbook is also available as a download on the Mission Resources website (www.umwmissionresources.org). If you don't have the current version of the Handbook, you may want to go with this option. Look for updated Handbooks to be available in 2017.

√2. The 2015-2016 Program Book: Growing in Blessedness

This yearly resource offers monthly programs (September through August), including the World Thank Offering for November, plus special programs for a Pledge to Mission Service and the 2016 Call to Prayer and Self-Denial. The programs can be a starting point for adapting the program to your own needs. Use the ideas, prayers and litanies and make them your own.

$\sqrt{3}$. The 2016 Prayer Calendar

Information about UMW projects, the mission personnel, photos, testimonies, prayers from around the world...Wow! Enrich your spiritual life and expand your horizons!

$\sqrt{4}$. *response* magazine

Keep current on the work of the UMW and social justice issues, grow spiritually with the Bible studies and prayers, and get ideas for programs. Subscribe as a local UMW so all the women of your church have access to this great resource.

$\sqrt{5}$. The 2016 Reading Program Catalog

If you didn't pick up this free resource at your district or conference annual meeting, you can download it from Mission Resources website.

√6. Mission Studies

These are the study books for the three Mission u studies. Make a copy of each study available for your women to read before going to Mission u, then use them when you offer the studies in your church.

Optional: Annual Sampler Subscription

If you subscribe to the Annual Sampler, you save \$5, but even better...those basic resources come right to your door when they're available. The 2016 Annual Sampler includes these resources that appear in 2016:

The 2016 Mission u will be held July 25-28 and July 29 (Overview Day) at the Hotel Mead and Conference Center in Wisconsin Rapids. We hope you will enjoy this new venue. The Mead has rooms to accommodate all of our needs. We will be able to eat, sleep, learn and fellowship together under one roof.

Registration, displays, meals, our plenary sessions, program resources and two classrooms will all be on the same level, with the remaining classrooms down a ramp that goes past the swimming pool. The Prayer and Meditation Room, office, Young Women's and Teens' rooms and Crafts will be on the second floor, accessible by an elevator. There will be a puzzle/game area and several spots including the terrace and gazebo where folks can simply visit and share.

Faculty persons who are confirmed include Laura Pfeffer, Rev. Dawn Jeffers-Ramstad, Awilda Nolla, Rev. Heather Brewer and Rev. Amanda Stein. The studies in 2016 will include *Climate Justice – A Call to Hope and Action*; a repeat of *Latin America*; and *The Bible and Human Sexuality – Claiming God's Good Gift*.

If you want to get the books prior to our session in July, I would recommend subscribing to the Annual Sampler. You will also receive the 2017 program book, prayer calendar and date book if you subscribe before April, 2016. Participants sometimes question the music that is part of our plenaries at Mission u. Please understand that the music is selected to enhance the studies; for example, when we are studying Latin America, we will be using music from that region. (And that means some of it will be in Spanish.) Also, as a global church, we can learn about our sisters and brothers in

Christ as we share in their musical traditions. The music we use during our plenaries and much of the plenary content is provided to us by National UMW at our Mission u training. It is also at these Mission u trainings that our faculty persons are given guidance on methods for teaching the class. Mission u topics are selected by a committee that includes National UMW, the General Board of Global Ministries and our publishing partners. There is a five year process to move from being a suggested topic to being a published study book.

We are always trying to address the questions and concerns that arise during Mission u. We want Mission u to be an enjoyable experience where you can concentrate on learning, growing and stretching your faith, and "expanding your concepts of mission". Please plan to join us at Hotel Mead in July!

We need 2,000 and the variety of labyrinths made by women from all over the country will bless the recipients and lend to the support and outreach we hope to extend. Attached is a pattern for the finger labyrinths. Each labyrinth will be tagged with a card identifying that the labyrinth is "handmade with love and prayer by United Methodist Women".

Please circulate this request and the attached pattern among the United Methodist Women with whom you have contact. Share that anyone interested in quilting the finger prayer labyrinth squares should email GCprayer@unitedmethodistwomen.org with an estimate of how many they might be able to make and to receive further instructions for shipping the completed labyrinths by the deadline.

Quilt Hand-Labyrinth Instructions

Materials: 8 ½" x 8 ½" quilt top fabric 8 ½" x 8 ½" batting 10 ½" x 10 ½" quilt backing fabric Labyrinth pattern (found below) Contrasting thread for machine-quilting the design



Center quilt top fabric (face up), batting, and quilt backing (face down). Baste or pin together, leaving 1" surplus of quilt backing around all edges.

Center the paper design (face up) on right side of the quilt top and pin or baste the paper pattern to the three layers. Or, you can trace the design on the right side of the top fabric.

Using a straight stitch, sew all four pieces together, following the labyrinth design, being sure to stitch all circuits of the design. Shortening the stitch length on your machine will help the paper tear away more easily.

Tear-away the paper pattern.

Using a satin or tight zig-zag stitch, retrace the entire labyrinth design on the straight stitch path.

Finish edges. Begin with corners, folding the backing over itself at 45 degree angles toward the quilt top, covering raw corners. Stitch each mitered corner in place. Then, fold the backing of each of the four sides in half way, then fold again, over the raw edge. Finish with a 1/4^{'''-3/8"} seam allowance.
