Interview with Heidi Careaga, Financial Chair for National UWF Office

Can you explain how you are involved with United Women in Faith?

I have been involved with United Women in Faith for almost 25 years. I have served in local units, district, and conference levels. I am currently serving with the Board of Directors and functioning as the Finance Chair this quadrennium (2020-2024). This gives me a place on various committees, such as the Executive committee, personnel committee, and the legacy fund steering committee, aside from the other committees that I have been assigned to within the board of directors.

The board of directors votes on many matters on behalf of the organization matters of properties, scholarships, grants, annual budget, audit, all the programming and education, and of course, that includes electing a new General Secretary if needed. Harriet Olson announced her retirement last fall, and the personnel committed worked with a search firm to search for potential candidates around the nation. It was a tedious process, and thankfully, we found the ideal candidate! We are grateful for our new General Secretary/CEO, Sally Vonner. She has served our organization faithfully for many years already, and her experience and gifts will give us a continuation to where we need to be "one foot in front of the other" as she mentioned in her speech during her installation.

As with most organizations, United Women in Faith is struggling with finances. I understand that you developed an idea to help raise funds that is now being used nationwide. Can you tell us about that?

#move4mission is an idea that came to me during my many walks and runs around the neighborhood during the pandemic. I was praying and brainstorming, and as I continued to see ads in social media for fundraisers such as 3k or 5k walks or runs or challenges I asked myself, why not do this 4 mission? I took the idea to the Senior Leadership Team and they approved it. I have teamed with Tamara Wims, our national treasurer and CFO, and other staff to develop the project to what UWFaith has access to today! We used an already set-up platform used by UWFaith's staff and the Upper New York Conference in 2018. This gives us an opportunity to move not only physically, but spiritually as we prepare to find creative ways to fun-raise! Fundraising does not have to be boring or difficult. #move4mission gives you the opportunity to share your UWFaith story and get new women interested in what we support as they sponsor you in your #move4misson event. The event can be just you moving (walking, hiking, crafting, writing), or you can do it as a unit, district, or conference event. The point is to have fun while raising funds for mission. What are the funds raised being used for?

This year, the #move4mission funding event(s) will support the Education and Leadership Development programs that our organization provides. This includes the reading program, Mission u training for teachers and leaders, Leadership development days, youth and adult education programs at NMI (National Mission Institutions), economic development training to international partners, The Future is Now Scholarships, the DHM program, and much more.

From Cherrie Hartley, Coordinator Program Resources

I always look forward to this time of year. I am usually anxious, and as excited as a kid in a candy store. Why? This is the time when the United Women in Faith publish the new list of books for the Reading Program. The 2024 list has been published and it lives up to expectations. This list of books never disappoints; it is varied, diverse, includes some great novels, books that are challenging, some controversial and many aimed at helping us work on our spiritual growth. There is something for everyone and I encourage you to check this new list. You will be happy you did. If you have never participated in the Reading Program, this is a good time to start. You will not be disappointed. You can enjoy this program as an individual or with a group of your friends. Furthermore, starting this year, you can also purchase the 2024 Reading Program books at bookshop.org/shop/uwfaith. That's a plus.

I want to share with you a book that I read which is on the 2024 Reading Program. It is very topical so I was glad to see that it was on the list. The title of the book is: THE BOOK OF ROSY A Mother's Story of Separation at the Border and the authors are Rosayra Pablo Cruz and Julia Schwietert Collazo. Rosayra (Rosy) is a Guatemalan woman with two sons who 'dares' to flee her country with her two boys and seek asylum in the United States. The title of the book gives you a clue as to her experience on entering this country. She is seized and put in detention at the Eloy detention Center and her sons are separated from her and sent elsewhere. She meets other female detainees who are all now dressed in drab green prison uniforms that conceal the used and soiled undergarments they are given to wear. The conditions in the center are intolerable and insufferable, and the guards take pleasure in tormenting them and always threatening them with disciplinary action such as solitary confinement. The guards are inhumane and treat the detainees as lesser humans, telling them that the suffering they are experiencing now is something the detainees brought on themselves.

"Among the many things that people don't understand about migration is this: No one wants to leave the people they love. Most people don't want to leave the land where they were born, or the soil where their umbilical cord was buried. If they believed that staying would ensure survival, they would never set off on such a treacherous journey. They would never walk through that door, fighting the impulse to look back with the deepest longing a person is capable of feeling. But since they know they are at risk, they put one foot in front of the other and try not to look back, trying to hold themselves together, even as they feel that they're being ripped into two jagged-edge pieces that will never fit neatly together ever again." These are Rosy's words about migration and she speaks for countless immigrants who are 'forced' to leave their country and go to other countries and suffer innumerable indignities when they would rather stay in their own country if that were feasible.

When separated moms are released from detention, they are asked several questions, including the question "what did you believe the future would hold for you and your children?". Surprisingly to some, a woman might respond that she doesn't know. Her vision spread only to the border. Beyond the border, life is a blank slate. Her ability to see the future is limited because she has no frame of reference for imagining life beyond the border. I encourage you to read this book. The story is painful but inspiring. You will want to know what happened to Rosy and her children and what role Julie played in Rosy's life.

Mary Lainberger, Dean of Mission u, introduced Heidi Careaga from Janesville & originally from Guatamala. Heidi is the SE & SW District Secretary for the Conference United Methodist Church, on the National United Women in Faith Program Advisory Board & is National United Women in Faith Finance Chair. Mary then introduced Lisa Jones, our keynote speaker who works for Wisdom.

9:00-9:30AM Why a New Name? Heidi Carega, showed a video on the United Women in Faith website. Our name has changed 20 times having Methodist in it for a short time. United Methodist Women has been planning to rebrand for 4 years. We now have two names-United Women in Faith & United Methodist Women (for finances only). The new name will refresh our organization reflecting our open doors. We want to continue to be united & have never required membership in the United Methodist Church so others can join. Our new logo represents our past, present & future of our organization & our diversity with multi-colored flames around the cross. Blue means faith, green-sisterhood (sisters in Christ/faith), orange-action & yellow-life of Christ. What is not changing-our mission, vision, purpose, pledge to mission, 5 channels of giving, deaconesses, home missioners, support of our national mission institutions, regional missionaries, social action days & response magazines. There are new innovations for Mission u & Leadership Development Days which is online. Healing & Joy on our journey to God is our theme for 2022. We added a new name, website, resources, Faith Talks & Voices from the Field, Thrive newsletter and Soul Care Retreats (to be added next year). There is an all access member option. Women are invited to be inspired, to influence others & to have an impact. Targeted giving has been added. We need to introduce more options to prospective members, make sure current members feel valued &

appreciated to help retention. Heidi asked us to continue to reach those without email by phone or snail mail. We need leaders now to lead the way to effect change, continue nurturing our unit & have soul care retreats. Our sisterhood is acting in faith to tackle the hard work of the world without hesitation & part of the hard work is keeping our church united. Luke 13 tells us we need to the have faith of a mustard seed by taking action & through hard work, sharing our faith and vision with others. We are women of faith & are called to take action. Matthew 28:19-20. "Go together and make disciples of all nations…" We read the mission, vision & purpose next.

Keynote Speaker, Lisa Jones, "Healing and Joy Through Interfaith Groups"

Lisa Jones, President of United Women in Faith at Brown Deer UMC, Executive Director & Lead organizer in Outreach for MICAH, part of WISDOM & Vice-President of the Connectional Table & on the anti-racism task force, was our keynote speaker. Lisa talked about racism. MICAH was started in Milwaukee in 1988 by an ecumenical group of pastors who asked what it would look like to come together to do justice. MICAH (Milwaukee Inner-City Allied for Hope) is an acronym from Micah 6:8 and preceded WISDOM. MICAH was the original affiate of WISDOM with David Liners, the organizer. What if we live our faith values consistently with those of diverse backgrounds? Healing & Joy have to be the result of our work. All ethnicities are included in MICAH in a beloved community.

"Bringing our Pain to the Cross"- Rev. Grace read Mark's rendition of a woman who had suffered 12 years & then touched Jesus' robe. Deb read from pg. 13, Matthew 8:17 asking us to read Isaiah 53:3,5. We were asked to write painful things that were done to us or others and things we did to others. After 10 minutes, we were asked to write and bring these things to Jesus and have the papers burned outside by the Pastor. A symbolic burning was done in the sanctuary. Pastor Grace read Rev. 21:1-5 followed by a unison reading of Isaiah 61:1-4 pg. 1314.

Business Meeting: Gloria Carter, President, presiding with Laura Pfeffer, Parliamentarian, called the meeting to order. Voting bar was set.

Secretary: Gloria asked for any corrections or additions to the Annual Gathering Minutes from 2021 pg. 27-28.

Pledge for 2022 remained \$185,000.00 and has been proposed to be \$150,000.00 for 2023 after discussion at the August '22 Meeting. We received \$30,000 for the Wisconsin Conference United Women in Faith and an additional \$30,000.00 from the estate of Helen Bennett from Rice Lake for the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund. Lisa encouraged applications for the Mabel Heil Scholarships for any woman who is a member of United Women in Faith or the United Methodist Church pg.51-53. A question was asked if a unit sent their pledge directly to National, would it be recognized and Lisa believed it would. Lisa suggested units & District members send their giving to their District Treasurers. Gloria asked the Executive Team to approve the Treasurer's Report-approved by consensus & filed for audit.

Mission u Nominations: Chris Anding, Conference Secretary and Mission u Nominations, announced the Slate of Officers-Mary Lainberger, Dean, Assistant Dean open, Registrar-Josie Gobel, Secretary-Chris Anding, Business Manager-Mary Rather, Nominations-Cindy Morse & Chris Anding. Gloria asked for a motion to suspend the standing rules regarding installing Mission u Officers -Diane Scorgie made a motion to suspend Standing Rules Sec. 2, pg. 60, Mary Garvens seconded-motion carried. Gloria asked for approval by vote of the Mission u Team-approved by vote.

Communications now open following Anne Scott's resignation. Gloria asked for a motion to approve the Slate of

Conference Officers 2023. A motion was made to approve the Slate of Officers by Gail Burgess, seconded by Billie LaBumbard-motion carried. Gloria asked for affirmation of the Committee on Racial Justice-approved by consensus.
