The national office of UMW is suggesting each UMW member give \$18.69 for 5 years towards the fund.

Monies for UMCOR should be given through your church's treasury and not through UMW. The goal is to get the monies to the mission field quicker.

Spiritual Growth **Is There Awe In Your Life?**

What in the world made me ask such a question, you might ask? Recently I bookmarked a lesson in the Adult Bible Studies because the angle the writer focused on in the story of the Shepherds on the night of the birth of Jesus was interesting. From my perspective it boiled down to what kind of feelings did the shepherds have that night 2,000 years ago – what did the experience do to them and how did that in turn impact others? But the author’s discussion provoked me to continue to think more about my experiences of **awe**-filled moments.....

When my husband passed away quite suddenly, I frequently went to a preserved marshland quite near where we lived in mid-Florida. And I would sit on a bench along the pathways, or walk on the paths throughout the marsh, take pictures, or read. An environment that had produced awe in our first visits there provided peace for me at that time. Thinking about AWE, I have had so many moments throughout my life that produced that feeling. If I tried to sit down and count those moments, there would be thousands of them. The vast majority would simply be things seen in this environment God gifted us with.

I think back and find moments of the feelings of awe in a classroom, a theater, in many pieces of music and lyrics, in things that pop out of people’s mouths—particularly children or youth--in meetings, workplaces and have never stopped being struck to the point of awe by the beauty or the vastness or the majesty of something only our supreme God could have created. In those moments my feelings are just as likely to come out in weeping as they are in huge smiles. Why weeping?? Because it is impossible to imagine those perfections being produced by anything but the hand of God. And if those perfections were produced by a person, I have no doubt that there was the spirit of God at hand.

This past fall, I was once again filled with one moment after another of awe-filled moments as we went from the North Shore into central Canada heading west and north and then down into northern North Dakota and Minnesota. Moments of never known history examined, color, small but craggy peaks to the vastness of farm country, the likes of which I had never witnessed before, and an unusual scenic valley in northern Dakota.

But, the shepherds experienced the best, the most exciting, the most fearsome moments – angels with a message that sent them to witness the greatest moment in time of all – the birth of a Babe who would provide grace for all who would grasp it in faith. What is the AWE in your life? Is it ever present, does it change you, does it give you joy and peace, does it produce a spirit in you that brings joy, love or peace to another? Are you in awe of God every day?



Social Action Coordinator Charter for Racial Justice

This past year **The 2014 Charter for Racial Justice Program** was put together by our Wisconsin Conference. Bev Maser and Billie LaBumbard are members of this Wisconsin UMW Racial Justice Committee, and I think we should thank them for this wonderful document. (We were all given a copy in our packet last fall at Cumberland.)

Based on situations this past fall in Ferguson,

New York, Cleveland and elsewhere, I can't believe how timely and relevant this program is! We need to take this document out and use it in discussions in our UMW Meetings, churches and communities. The focus statements from the Charter for Racial Justice that APPLIES is: WE BELIEVE #2 racism is a rejection of the teachings of Jesus Christ and WE WILL #2 create opportunities in local churches to deal honestly with existing racist attitudes and social distance between members, deepening the commitment to the church where all racial groups and economic classes come together. It has a definition of racism and white privilege from Tim Wise: "Racism is a system of inequality, based on race. White privilege refers to any advantage, opportunity, benefit, head start or general protection from negative societal mistreatment, which persons deemed white will typically enjoy, but which others will generally not enjoy. White privilege is the flip side of discrimination against people of color".

Our *Racial Justice Charter News letter* from December 2014 also gives a definition of institutional racism: "it is the use of power for maintaining privilege and systematic discrimination through institutions and structures of society. Institutional racism is racial prejudice plus the misuse of power by systems and institutions".

Racism (and protests against it) are occurring everywhere including the Mall of America. It is a northern Wisconsin thing, whether we openly recognize it, and discuss it, or not. I handed out the 2014 Racial Justice program at our Spooner UMW Christmas Tea in December and it led to a really sincere, caring discussion about experiences of racism in our lives. Eli Weizel, Nobel peace prize winner, says "Where ever there is silence this connotes agreement". He was referring to the extermination of Jews by Germans during the Holocaust, but couldn't it still apply to these racial occurrences in America today? Silence connotes agreement SO speak up when you have the opportunity.

Morning Speaker



Reverend Barbara Certa-Werner - "Who Gets the Credit?"

Reverend Barbara Certa-Werner will be speaking about how UMW influenced her life when she was young and how that led her into ministry. She was born in Chicago, Illinois. Received her Bachelor's Degree in Psychology in Chicago in 1991. After marrying Joel Werner in 1993 she received her Master's of Divinity in 1995 and became an ordained Elder in the United Methodist Church, Wisconsin Conference in 1998. Reverend Barbara Certa-Werner has worked as a volunteer at various homeless shelters in Chicago and Green Bay for a total of 29 years. Among her other achievements, she founded the Harbor House Crisis Shelter in 2001.

Afternoon Focus Groups

Partner with Harbor House - Reverend Barb Certa-Werner will talk about Harbor House and share some ways our UMW units can participate in meeting the needs of Harbor House through fundraising, individual work projects, donations of needed items plus a variety of other ideas you may not have thought about.

The Church and People with Disabilities ~ lead by Liz Demsey and Billie LaBumbard.

Many of us are experiencing disabilities of our own so is our church staying in tune with that? It is important, however, for our churches to be responsive to all of the issues that our potential parishioners or future parishioners might experience as a visitor or member of our church? Has our church responded to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1991? What have we perhaps not responded to? This Focus Group will provide a handout that your church trustees can use to evaluate the sensitivities of our people with disabilities. For instance, are your ushers sensitive to the needs of those who come into the church with a disability? Has our sound system addressed the issues of tone deafness, not just sound deafness? We will also discuss how congregations are dealing with or returning warriors. Join us in this Focus Group so you can become more aware of those with disabilities and how our churches can respond!

Homelessness - lead by Tom and Duana Bremer - Salvation Army Coordinators for Washburn County. Homelessness occurs when people or households are unable to acquire and/or maintain housing they can afford. This is a complex problem, but one which we can and MUST work to eliminate. This is your opportunity to learn how the Salvation Army is one organization helping to combat that problem.

Directions to First United Methodist Church in Rice Lake

From Highway 53, take the Highway 48 exit at the north end of the city, turn, east, toward Cumberland. Go a short distance and then south on West Avenue (between Don Johnson Motors and the Motor Vehicle Department). Turn left on Augusta Street, take the bridge over Highway 53. Turn right, midway down the hill, onto Kleusch, or if you miss it, you can turn on Hilltop also to reach the parking lot. The church is well marked on Augusta Street.

Benjamin's House Emergency Shelter

Benjamin's House works with resources already available in Barron County communities to help shelter residents find employment, housing and medical assistance. They have 17 rooms sponsored by an organization or a family that provides furnishings and decorations.

Ongoing needs are: bath towels, plastic gloves, heavy duty 39 gallon garbage bags, 13 gallon drawstring garbage bags, Ziploc bags of any size, disinfectant wipes and full-size shampoos.

The Mabel Heil Scholarships are a result of funds from the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a woman from Cuba City, Wisconsin. The first scholarships were granted in 1981. Since then more than 240 women have received help with their education.

Requirements and Instructions

Instructions:

1. Be a female member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women.
2. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what way do I consider myself a worthy student?"
3. Send the completed application form to the contact person by May 1 for the Fall semester or October 1 for the Spring semester.
4. Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by the president of the local United Methodist Women or the pastor of the church.
5. Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative.

Rules:

Any member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women working to improve her education may apply.

Please have all letters written (preferably typed) on one side of 8 1/2 by 11 sheet of white paper using black ink.

All applications are photocopied for the committee members.

Scholarships are awarded one semester at a time. To be considered again DURING a one-year period, you must send a letter asking to be considered. AFTER one year, you will need to fill out another form and secure new recommendations.

If in any given year there is an increase of applications, these priorities will be followed: Women responsible for others will be favored. Women preparing to return to the employment field will be favored.

Application and two (2) letters of recommendation must be postmarked no later than May 1 and October 1 to be considered.

Schedule:

1st Semester: Apply by May 1; notified by June 1; check sent by August 15.

2nd Semester: Apply by October 1; notified by November 1; check sent by December 1.




