MONEY MATTERS FROM OUR DISTRICT TREASURER.....

Greetings from the money desk!

Monies received from units were down in 2021 due to the fact that many units depleted their accounts in 2020 thinking they'd be back to meeting together, having fundraisers, special events and in general – just getting back to page one in 2021. Little did we know unvaccinated people and multiple COVID variants would cause us to go under cover again.

We can be very grateful, however, that our units came through with sacrificial giving sending in \$24,883.55 in the 5-Channel mission giving. That's a shade over 55% of the District's \$45,000 Pledge to Mission. As a reminder, the 5-Channel giving includes Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition, Gift to Mission, Gift in Memory and World Thank Offering. As an aside, units also sent in \$1,424 for Call to Prayer & Self Denial, \$378 for Mission u and \$400 for two projects. These units are amazing!

Unit treasurers received their unit statement and other remittance info in Mid-January along with a 2022 Pledge to Mission form if to date none was on record with me. As a reminder –

1. Inform me asap of any changes to your address or phone number.
2. Let someone know where your unit records are kept in the event of death or other circumstance. (Unfortunately, this has happened as recent as September, 2021.)
3. It is good to have your unit financials audited annually.

It's my prayer, and that of many, to be able to meet together and praise the Almighty God who sustains us in all things.


Plan 2: 10 books a year (two books from each category)

Membership Outreach & Program Resources 2 year term	Plan a team building exercise for each team meeting. Assign team members to Sister Units. Help locals complete the membership census. Publicize and encourage participation in the Reading Program.
Social Action and Mission Education 2 year term	Research social action issues at the conference and national levels. Suggest three social action goals for the Leadership Team to emphasize throughout the year. Inform the Leadership Team and local units about UMW mission projects.
Committee on Nominations 4 year term (shorter terms are possible)	Committee members share in the task of finding candidates to fill vacancies on the Leadership Team.

MABEL HEIL SCHOLARSHIP

The Mabel Heil Scholarships are a result of funds from the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a woman from Cuba City, Wisconsin. The first scholarships were granted in 1981. Since then more than 240 women have received help with their education.

Requirements and Instructions

Instructions:

Be a female member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women.

Submit a written answer to the question, "In what way do I consider myself a worthy student?"

Send the completed application form to the contact person by May 1 for the Fall semester or October 1 for the Spring semester.

Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by the president of the local United Methodist Women or the pastor of the church.

Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative.

Rules:

Any member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women working to improve her education may apply.

Please have all letters written (preferably typed) on one side of 8 1/2 by 11 sheet of white paper using black ink.

All applications are photocopied for the committee members.

Scholarships are awarded one semester at a time. To be considered again DURING a one-year period, you must send a letter asking to be considered. AFTER one year, you will need to fill out another form and secure new recommendations.

If in any given year there is an increase of applications, these priorities will be followed: Women responsible for others will be favored. Women preparing to return to the employment field will be favored.

Application and two (2) letters of recommendation must be postmarked no later than May 1 and October 1 to be considered.

Schedule:

1st Semester: Apply by May 1; notified by June 1; check sent by August 15.

2nd Semester: Apply by October 1; notified by November 1; check sent by December 1.
