Greetings from Dodgeville!

As I write this article for “Mission Matters” I am still mentally processing my experience at last week’s Mission U. It is my hope that the information and inspiration that I feel now will carry me and all of my UMW sisters through years of mission and service for many years to come.

This year’s Social Issue Study was based on the book “Climate Justice, A Call to Hope and Action” and is edited by Pat Watkins. This is a book that could be of benefit to all UMC congregations. It contains eight chapters, each written by a different author. The first chapter written by Pat Watkins asks us to examine our relationships between God and the Earth and how they are interconnected. If we lose one how would that affect the other? As one of the posters on the wall in the classroom said “There is no Plan-

et B”. In the second chapter, written by Rosemarie Wenner, she reminds us that “we are neither the owners nor the makers of the world” but rather we have been created to practice good stewardship of the world that God has created and “as stewards have to make use of the world and relate to our fellow creatures in a way that pleases God”. As we worked through the study I found that it would be easy to become discouraged and overwhelmed by the sheer enormity of the many issues that affect the environment and the standard of living of the world’s population. However, also in the second chapter, is this quote that is an African proverb—“Many little people, in many little places, taking many little steps, can change the face of the world”. This reminds us that if each person, in every

Be the Person God Created You To Be

Back in my early 20’s, I was an elementary school teacher. My classroom was filled with noise and chaos, messiness and disorder, busyness and nonstop action while young children played and learned. I knew that I loved to teach. But the problem was that deep down I knew that this wasn’t a good job for me. I like quiet and peace, order and neatness. I like to meditate and plan, create and write, and a busy classroom was not the place where I could do these things.

God created me to teach and encourage others, but God also created me to need a quiet environment so that I could meditate and create and recharge. By teaching in an elementary school classroom, I wasn’t being true to the person God created me to be.

The book of Job has a wonderfully beautiful and simple verse that helps us to understand the need to be ourselves. Job 37:5-6 (ERV) reads:

God’s thundering voice is amazing! He does great things that we cannot understand. He says to the snow, ‘Fall on the earth.’ And he says to the rain, ‘Pour down on the earth.’

So, God says to the snow, “Fall on the earth.” That’s it. Just do one thing. Fall. And then God says to the rain, “Pour down on the earth.” God is saying, Just do what I’ve created you to do. You’re rain ... so rain. You’re snow ... so snow. What did God create you to do? Who did God create you to be?

Sometimes we are so influenced by what other people think of us, that we lose sight of who we

church all over the world would start to make changes; and if we worked to get the governments and corporations to work together the planet can be saved. We are reminded that “giving up hope is not an option”.

The United Methodist Women have been leaders in global efforts to join together with people working all over the earth for peace, justice, and the healing of creation. The “Be Just. Be Green.” project has developed the “13 Steps to Sustainability”. This program was developed in 2014 and a guide to help us use these 13 social justice and environmental justice principles in our churches and communities can be found by consulting the website at www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/environment.

In the book of Jeremiah, chapter 29, verse 11 we read “For surely I know the plans I have for you,

says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope”. I’m sure that many units of UMW and many UMC churches are already taking steps toward climate justice in your own communities. Let’s all strive to be a part of the movement that will move toward climate justice throughout all of God’s creation and to choose hope and not despair when facing the challenges of these efforts. “We can’t do everything, but we can do something”.




