

Mabel Heil Scholarships support women and girls with working to improve their education. Priority is given to women responsible for others and women preparing to return to the workforce. Any female member of United Methodist Women in Wisconsin may apply for funds. Applicants must supply a written answer to the question "In what ways do I consider myself a worthy student?" One letter of recommendation must be from the local UMW president or local pastor. A second letter of recommendation must be from a church member who is not a relative or member of your household. Hello once again from Dodgeville! I truly hope everyone is enjoying some beautiful fall weather.

Thank you to everyone who organized our Annual Gathering—"Growing in Blessedness". It was truly an event that "blessed" everyone that attended. As I was preparing a display for this event and exploring the UMW website I discovered a project that was new to me, even though it has been in operation for 30 years or so! This organization—one that we support with our mission giving— is called MADRE. I just want to share a little of what we can find on their website—(https:

www.madre.org/)

"MADRE partners with grassroots women's groups worldwide, and works with local populations that United Methodist Women on its own could never reach. The organization partners especially with groups that help women and children who are facing war, disaster, and their aftermath." Through our mission giving in 2016 we have "helped to provide shelters in war-torn Iraq for women who are fleeing sexual violence there, and in Nicaragua we helped to launch a women's rights radio station to support rural women who are often victims of abuse. In Kenya and Nicaragua, MADRE helped communities who have been hard-hit by drought and flooding due to climate change."

Through MADRE, UMW is proud to help support a therapy program for women and girl child soldiers in Colombia. United Methodist Women is supporting the program for two years. Through the generous support of UMW we helped to: Protect reproductive rights for Syrian refugee women and girls, deliver clean water to women facing drought in Kenya, helped indigenous Ixil women in Guatemala

sustain their families, and in Nicaragua we helped to launch a lifesaving radio program for abused women.

As is stated on the UMW website-- http://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/service-advocacy—"in all advocacy efforts United Methodist Women supports its work with a scriptural basis and adheres to the denominational mandates in the Book of Discipline and Book of Resolutions of The United Methodist Church. United Methodist Women works in partnership with coalitions on many justice issues to extend its reach."

Truly, by supporting these programs we are "turning faith, hope, and love into action on behalf of women, children, and youth around the world".

Good-bye for now, I hope to see you in a few weeks at the Conference Annual Gathering in Eau Claire!
