Treasurer's Note



UMW Treasurers,

As the calendar swings around to my favorite time of year – the fall, I begin to think seriously about the topic of thankfulness. I take out my World Thank Offering box and consider if I have actually been adding as much to it as I should have over the year. Of course, in the midst of difficulties and busyness it is easy to forget to be thankful and recent experience might make it seem as if there is less to be thankful for than usual, but in truth thankfulness is less about the number of great things happening in your life and more about how you view whatever happens to and around you. I always love that call and response “God is good – all the time, and all the time – God is good”, but I sometimes wonder how well I remember this when goodness is not the most immediate thing on my mind.

I will admit to a fondness for the biblical book of Job. Not so much from a schadenfreude attitude of “well at least my life isn’t as bad as that”, but more of the ways in which the character of Job questions the assumptions of those around him about what his life circumstance really says about him and about God. One of the things I resonate with the most about this story is that your life can be going in crazy, terrible directions and yet God can still be good. Although in the end of the story God seems more like a fairy-godmother restoring everything (X10) back to Job, God is obviously listening and caring for Job even when it doesn’t look like it to anyone else. Even when Job breaks down and demands some sort of explanation and God turns around with the rather unsatisfactory answer of “because I’m God and you aren’t”, God is engaged and seeking to give Job answers in the midst of confusion. Job never doubts that God’s vision of Job is not about Job’s current circumstances, but about understanding his faithful heart.

So, I’m thankful to God for your faithfulness. In truth our finances are down this year. I will be sending out Q3 reports to local treasurers soon, but our district is only at ~40% of our pledge this year. We were at this level in the Spring last year, so we are definitely behind. We have also recognized that our future giving as a district may not reach the same levels as the past and have dropped our pledge to the conference for next year. Yet, I am thankful for all of the gifts which continue to be given in the name of mission. God is still at work stirring your hearts to be engaged with the work of putting faith, hope and love into action. I am thankful for the smaller signs of grace such as the over \$500 pledge offering collected at our Annual Gathering this September. We were small in number, but great in giving. So, I am practicing thankfulness in this season because I know God’s faithfulness never fails us. Thanks be to God.

Wisconsin Conference UMW Assembly 2022 Scholarships

Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women is offering scholarships to attend Assembly 2022 at the Orange County Convention Center – West Concourse in Orlando, FL May 20-22, 2022 in-person or virtually. Scholarships will be awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis until funds are exhausted.

In-person attendees	up to \$1,000
Virtual attendees	up to \$199

Scholarship money may be used for expenses such as registration, hotel, and travel. Event registration is the responsibility of the individual (<https://assembly2022.org> see registration information), but contact the conference liaison (see below) if help is needed.

Travel arrangements are the responsibility of the individual. Travel costs may vary depending upon flights available. Due to the uncertainty of COVID, you are **highly** encouraged to purchase travel insurance in case of cancellation. Current prices estimate flights from Madison of \$450-500 round trip. Milwaukee or Chicago flights are likely to be cheaper.

The Wisconsin Conference hotel block is available at the Hilton Orlando for \$178 + tax per night **until December 1, 2021** or block is full. Rooms are single/doubles and have 1 double bed (see additional information in this newsletter to stay in the Wisconsin room block or plan to make your own arrangements).
