Peggy is an excellent speaker, and these are very relevant social issues today.

I also took the Spiritual Growth class at Mission U based on the study book "Practicing Resurrection: The Gospel of Mark and Radical Discipleship" and found it inspiring. So, I know the presentation by Rev. Sue D'Alessio in the afternoon will be very worthwhile, and the afternoon will conclude with communion.

I'm already starting to think about 2021, and I need to find locations for the two events. We try to have one in the northern half of our district and one in the southern half of the district, since we've already used the most central locations. Treasurer's Report for 2019

2019 was a great year! Thank you for your financial support of United Methodist Women!

We exceeded our pledge by 123%. Our pledge was \$65,000 and the five-star category of giving was \$80,152! Total local support, including other giving, sent to the Wisconsin Conference and directly to charities was \$86,563. In addition, collections at our two gatherings raised \$ 1,301.
