

GREEN UPDATE SPRING 2011

National Action:

On February 28th an action alert was sent to urge faithful Christians to contact their US Senators and Representative to support the US Environmental Protection Agency as it works to enforce the Clean Air Act. Several measures have been introduced to either cut funding for the EPA or for efforts to promote energy efficiency and renewable energy development. We must continue to work for a sustainable and healthy future for all God's creation.

State Action:

The upcoming Wisconsin state budget proposed by Governor Walker includes at least two areas of concern. One is a proposed change to rules regulating phosphorus levels in water. The proposed "narrative" regulation would likely be in violation of the Federal Clean Water act. As a state bordering the Great Lakes, we have a special responsibility to keep our run off from choking our lakes and streams. The second proposal is to end state support for mandatory recycling. Cities and Towns would be faced with increased costs to their recycling programs which would probably mean a cut in the types of items recycled, not only adding to our need for more landfill space, but also undermining efforts by companies to use recycled materials in their products. Please contact your state representative and senator to urge them to continue to invest in the environmental health of our state.
