

Unit Survey Report

Hello, Hello United Methodist Women of Wisconsin! My prayer is that you are weathering the COVID 19 pandemic. I pray for your health and wellbeing and for that of your family and friends. Being the nurturing, caring women I know you to be I'm sure you are caring for one another. We are in this together and have each other and our God to rely on for spiritual sustenance. I want to thank all of our presidents, membership nurture and outreach coordinators (MNOs) and any others who've had a part in completing our 2020 Unit Survey (formerly Membership Census). I have not heard from our New York Office (NYO) about the final results of our efforts. After I hear from them it is my plan to do some analysis send each district president and membership nurture and outreach coordinator information about your results. I encourage your district leadership team to share it with units and use the questionnaire data to plan for next year. Yes, we still can plan for next year even though change is coming!

As you know our goal for each year is to have 100% of our units report their membership and answer the online survey. This year our number of units reporting declined as might be expected. We think that is due to the COVID 19 Pandemic and our demographics. As I write this article we do not know what percentage of our units answered the online membership survey. We do know that several units have gone inactive. We want to help those members who wish to fulfill our PURPOSE and continue UMW mission work stay connected. We have a team at the Conference level working on documentation to share ways to do that. Information about district membership, forming district units and joining nearby units is being developed and will be presented to the Conference team for review and approval in August. After it is approved we will make it available to district leadership.

2021 Annual Gathering Breakout Sessions

People Helping People- Rev. Bill Harris-Founded in 1998, PHP is a faith-based, non-profit charity whose mission is to strengthen our community by giving direct help to low-income families and disadvantaged job seekers. PHP provides families with food, children's clothing and school supplies throughout the year, and provides free career training and personal mentoring to people who have the most difficulty getting jobs and staying employed.

Neighborly Free Store and Backpack Project- Jim and Becky Hovde- The Neighborly Store-Serves anyone who needs clothing that is clean and ready to wear for school, work, or church and will help the wearer to feel confident. Entirely staffed by volunteers, we sort, size, and hang clothing, help shoppers find what they need, and provide new socks and undies every three months. Neighbors helping neighbors. The Backpack Project- The Mission: To reach financially challenged and situationally disadvantaged children who attend the Baraboo Public Schools in a personal and caring way, and to equip them with the supplies they need to walk in the school doors "Just Like Everyone Else". Our program is different because the kids get to "shop" for their backpack and supplies, pick up free books, socks and underwear, and packs of hygiene items. They enter the school doors just like everyone else, ready to learn, without the stigma of poverty or other challenges.

Good Trouble Team- David Kell, et.al- The "Good Trouble" group is in the process of becoming. We are not complete. We are working on understanding our own unconscious biases and white privilege. We are learning about different ways to overcome racial divisions. We seek social justice and racial equality for all groups and individuals by educating ourselves and others and actively challenging the structures and attitudes that underpin racism.

Cross cultural appointments- Rev. Lamarr Gibson- Rev. Gibson heads up the Anti-Racism Task Force which along with a Connectional Table task force will be designing a protocol/program for multicultural relations in Wisconsin, including training for churches and clergy.

Ho-Chunk Presence and Impact- Representative Kristin K. White Eagle – Ho- Chunk Nation Legislature- District II- Learn about One Sauk, Naturally and Indigenous People's Day.

Helen Robinson retires as Chair of the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund


THANK YOU Helen for your many years of outstanding service as Chair of the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund.
