Treasurer's Note

UMW Treasurers,

I am very thankful for the persistence of units in fundraising and giving in 2022. After a large shortfall in 2021 we are gradually coming back to a more normal pattern of giving. We raised 88% of our pledge for 2022. This is less than historical giving but much more in the range of our usual amounts. Clearly units are adapting and coming to terms with their own new normal. We have increased the number of 5-star units to 10 as local units have found creative ways to access all 5-channels of giving during the year. I have sent out year-end reports to units who gave in 2022 for your records as well as new forms and updates to all unit treasurers.

I hope you are finding lots of resources and ways to tell our mission story. I have found the Faith Talks webinar/podcasts to be wonderful ways to become aware of our mission institutions, partnerships and faith development. Of course, **response** magazine continues to be an avenue of reading and sharing mission stories and stories of outreach done by other units. There are lots of special resources as well such as a new Bible study on the School-to-Prison pipeline and monthly meetings of groups like "Just Energy 4 All" as well as on-line groups through Mighty Networks. Last, but certainly not least, your Conference and District are offering events: District Spiritual Retreat, Conference Social Action Day and Mission u and I hope you will encourage as many as possible to attend these events centered on deepening our commitment to mission and God's call to be in mission throughout the world. Our mission work is truly vital and transformative and I thank you for your continued support for it.

Please send checks along with the remittance forms to my address in order for your money to be processed in a timely manner. Please make checks out to our new official name: **South West District United Women in Faith** (not to me or to my office).

Although local treasurers are not (to my knowledge) in the habit of sending copies of their yearly audit/review to the district treasurer as well as the local president, I hope that you are being contentious and accountable to best practices by going through this process on a yearly basis. We are entrusted with money and it is important to make sure your records are accurate and all transactions are accounted for properly. It is also good practice to send notice for tax filling to anyone who gave more than \$250 to your unit in a year (this has become less important since fewer people itemize their deductions these days, but is still a good idea).

I look forward to celebrating your mission giving and support in 2023.

Day of Enrichment 2022—Crossroads-Waunakee UMC

South West District Day of Enrichment was held at Crossroads-Waunakee United Methodist Church on November 12th. Our theme was Status of our Schools. Our keynote speaker Mary Baker presented an update on the status of America's children, based on information from Children's Defense Fund. Eileen Bennett presented information about how to address bullying in our schools. Our special guest for the day was Amanda Stein, our new SW District Superintendent. The program also included Unit Sharing and Reading Program reports by Laura Pfeffer and Mary Ann Morack. Carol Lange led a Litany on Psalm 100 during our offering. Communion was led by Pastor Luis Velasquez of Crossroads UMC. The program was a half day this year, followed by lunch at a local café.

Thank you for all the great participation in Unit Sharing! We will be sure to allow more time for this next year. Here are some of the things our local units are doing:

Baraboo 1st: Hosted WI Conference Annual Gathering, made cookies for the construction crew and library staff while the area was under construction, "At Home" remembrances, Project Period, Prayer Shawl ministry, Backpack project, Neighborly Free Store.

Lodi: Collecting nickels for Northcott, scholarships for children to attend camp, summer meal program, collected school supplies for teachers.

Platteville: Collected gloves, mittens, socks for Preschool through High School, contributed to weekend backpack program.

Bethany: Raised money for missions, contributed to Youth mission trip, participated in Food Pantry, sent cards & treats to college students, Playing Field preschool, new children's choir leader.

Columbus: Ecumenical Loving Lunches program for children when school is not in session, hosted Club House school-aged childcare program on days when there was no school, including summer vacation.

Midland: Support 3 local food pantries, offer camp scholarships, support Helping Hands Fund.

Dodgeville: Held 2 rummage/book sales, served funeral lunches, supporting 8 different community projects, contributing to Red Bird Mission, Harbor House, Northcott, and UMCS.

Crossroads: Held bake sales throughout the year to benefit mission giving, whole church volunteers at a local school.

We also asked what the issues are in their local school districts and how local units could help children. Here are some of the comments: funding for Special Ed too low, teacher salaries too low, respect for teachers and school boards is low – attend school board meetings and promote respect on social media, racial disparities, lunch programs are under-funded (especially in the summer), bullying – Promote "Be Kind" program started in Sauk Prairie, gun violence, students still need emotional support because of COVID.

Day of Enrichment this year will be held in Columbus on November 11th from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. Lunch will be served at the church after the program.

NEWS FROM NORTHCOTT NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSE REPRESENTATIVE

Saturday, September 17th, I attended the Southwest District 2022 Annual Gathering at Cuba City UMC. I found myself saying **YES** to becoming the new Northcott representative on the District Team.

We have been fortunate to have Carol Lange share all the Northcott Neighborhood House news for us for the past years. I am looking so forward to learning more about Northcott. I am happy to be joining the SW District team to learn, grow and become more involved.

It has been a busy few months with Northcott hosting a TRUNK or TREAT event on Halloween. It was a safe and fun event for more than 1.200 children.

I was happy to see they provided a Thanksgiving Dinner Giveaway on November 24th. A total of 1,000 bags were packed by volunteers. They contained home-cooked meals for 4 people. Daddy's Soul Food & Grille suppled the meal of chicken, mashed potatoes, gravy, corn, rolls and pound cake.

'TIS THE SEASON Christmas event was once again held at Northcott on December 25th. They served home cooked meals from Daddy's Soul Food & Grille to over 4,200 families and individuals. They gave out over 5,000 wrapped toys to children. The event was a success due to more than 100 volunteers, donors and local churches. It was a rewarding feeling for the volunteers to see the smiles on Christmas morning. Families were grateful for the acts of kindness.

On Thursday, December 29th, a homicide candlelight vigil was held at Ephesians Missionary Baptist Church with Pastor Raymond Monk.

Forever in Our Hearts has been sponsored by Northcott and other organizations since 1992. The vigil brings people together who have lost a love one through homicide. Elizabeth Coggs of Northcott introduced the speakers who were law enforcement officers, elected officers and other individuals who for years have been involved with this program. I was fortunate to watch this program on YouTube. Bible verses were mentioned that were to bring peace and support for the families attending. This year there were over 200 names that were read, and we were all asked to make a commitment to help stop this violence.
