I'm writing this article at 35,000 feet above the earth on my return flight from a Volunteer in Mission trip to Philippines. As a team of five we are flying two very long flights.

One of our destinations was Isabella Province north of Manilla. That was a van ride 7 hours north of Manilla into the mountains.

What I experienced on this trip?

- Philippine Christians practice RADICAL HOSPITALITY. We worshiped together, we were fed many delicious meals and received certificates, gifts and hugs.
- Serving us all the different delightful treats and meals, included many varieties of fish and sea food, many treats including coconut, fresh coconut milk by straw, two different kinds of rice and many rice treats, fresh fruits including mangoes and papaya and little sweet bananas. All kinds of salads, pork and chicken were served.
- The love of Christ was shining in the faces of the women (WSCS/ UMW) and children in the school we visited. During church the praise music was lively.
- I learned I can keep up even though I'm a bit older and slower. Except for the UMYF games that included kneeling.... I had to take a bench after 3 kneels. Ouch!
- God's already at work in the Philippines and we're so privileged to be a part of the local ministries
- We participated in the local village medical ministry including medical, dental, praying and giving Bibles for those that wanted one. Pharmacy as prescribed and blood pressure screening.
- We participated in K-6th grade school support with food for lunch, school supplies for each child and teacher supplies including reems of paper and chalk
- We visited and prayed with the family that we have helped since the last typhoon. Their new house had reinforced brick, and a strong roof. It still needs windows.
- Flexibility and patience are important in God's workers and missionaries. It's God's schedule not ours.
- Clean water is important for our health (John Wesley said that)
- We can be so thankful, Romans 12: 4-6, 9-10. Each Team member has unique gifts...... leading music, devotions, and Sunday School, preaching, planning, keeping track of dollars and pesos, loving people in a positive way, being a calming presence, attention to details, infectious praising God, and helping others.

MABEL HEIL SCHOLARSHIP FUND......WISCONSIN CONFERENCE

Purpose: The Mabel Heil Scholarship is made possible by earnings from a trust established in the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a resident of Cuba City, Wisconsin. Funds are awarded by the Heil Scholarship

Committee of the Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women, and are invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation. Any Wisconsin United Methodist woman working to improve her education

may apply.

Available Funds:

- a. Funds will be invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, in a fund split 60% equity and 40% fixed.
- b. Funds available to provide scholarships for each semester will be calculated as 2.5% of the fair market value of the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund as of the end of the month prior to the approval of scholarships.

Eligibility Requirements:

a. Must be a female member of the United Woman in Faith and/or United Methodist Church, Wisconsin Conference

- b. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what ways do I consider myself a worthy student?"
- c. Letter of recommendation from either the president of the local UWF unit or from your pastor.

d. Letter of recommendation from a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative. (Person writing letter on behalf of applicant is to send the letter directly to the contact person.)

e. All letters must be written (preferably typed) on one side of an 8.5x11" sheet of white paper using black ink.

Application Procedure:

a. Awarded for one semester at a time. To be considered again for any subsequent semester, send a letter asking to be considered

b. Graduate students may apply for each semester as long as they meet the other requirements. c. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation OR RECONSIDERATION LETTER must be received by May 1 for the fall semester or October 1 for the spring semester. Checks will be disbursed by August 15 and January 15.

The challenge each year is to try at least 1 new criterion during the year.

□ Plan programs that encourage spiritual growth. (occasionally used Program book or *response* magazine)

Create prayer partners with other church groups. (Prayer chains, World Day of Prayer, etc.)

□ Pray using the Prayer Calendar at meetings.

□Organize the spiritual growth study from Mission u, possibly several evenings/weeks.

HOPE - to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ;

□ Take advantage of opportunities through UMW. (Mission u, Spiritual Growth Retreats, Annual Gatherings, Mission Action Day) □ Set aside a time to go over the year's plans using Mission Today Mission Tasks.

□ Implement the Charter for Racial Justice.

□ Present a mission study from Mission u, inviting church members.

LOVE - to develop a creative, supportive fellowship;

□ Honor the organization's leaders and member's contributions with Special Mission Recognition pins.

Encourage everyone to visit or invite visitors to/from other local UMW organizations.

□Publicize your events using newsletters, bulletin boards, Sunday bulletins, social media, phone calls, etc.

 \Box Plan a year-end program to give thanks and celebrate your accomplishments.

□ Plan visits to former members or friends of UMW who are unable to attend due to illness or residing in rest homes, etc.

ACTION – and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

Encourage all members to participate in the Pledge for Mission; give reports of where the money goes.

□Involve all members in fundraising (think outside the box)

Contribute to scholarships related to UMW programs such as Mission u and seminar experiences.

□ Partner with a mission institution such as Harbor House, Northcott, or UM Children's Services of Wisconsin.

Lynn lives in Hudson, Wisconsin and presently works at US Bank. Lynn has 30 years of experience as a school teacher and was appointed by the Hudson Common Council by her peers to represent District 2 in Hudson until the special election this April.

Lynn received a degree in sociology with a focus on juvenile development and gerontology from Baylor University and later a Masters from the University of Wisconsin – River Falls.

Lynn also volunteers as a Court-Appointed Special Advocate (CASA). The CASA program is intended to support minors whose guardians are processing through the court system. A Court Appointed Special Advocate is an adult who becomes a mainstay for a child, offering steady, interactive presence while also being the child's voice to the judge.

Duana is the director of the Salvation Army in St. Croix, Polk and Burnett counties. Duana has been serving local communities in this capacity for nearly 15 years. Her leadership, knowledge and dedication to the less fortunate in our communities is what guides the Salvation Army's decisions, programming and care for our communities.
