MISSION TODAY REPORT FORM – Tasks for 2024

Becoming a Mission Today UMW means that you have completed two (2) tasks from each criterion: Faith, Hope, Love, and Action. Think outside the box; there may be things you did this year that fit the criteria. The box following each criterion allows you to explain something that you feel fit the criteria you find on the other side of this form. The challenge each year is to try at least 1 new criterion during the year.

FAITH – United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose PURPOSE is to know God......

□ Plan programs that encourage spiritual growth. (occasionally used Program book or *response* magazine)

Create prayer partners with other church groups. (Prayer chains, World Day of Prayer, etc.)

□ Pray using the Prayer Calendar at meetings.

□Organize the spiritual growth study from Mission u, possibly several evenings/weeks.

HOPE - to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ;

Take advantage of opportunities through UMW. (Mission u, Spiritual Growth Retreats, Annual Gatherings, Mission Action Day)

Set aside a time to go over the year's plans using Mission Today Mission Tasks.

Implement the Charter for Racial Justice.

□ Present a mission study from Mission u, inviting church members.

LOVE - to develop a creative, supportive fellowship;

□ Honor the organization's leaders and member's contributions with Special Mission Recognition pins.

Encourage everyone to visit or invite visitors to/from other local UMW organizations.

□Publicize your events using newsletters, bulletin boards, Sunday bulletins, social media, phone calls, etc.

□ Plan a year-end program to give thanks and celebrate your accomplishments.

□Plan visits to former members or friends of UMW who are unable to attend due to illness or residing in rest homes, etc.

ACTION – and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

Encourage all members to participate in the Pledge for Mission; give reports of where the money goes.

Involve all members in fundraising (think outside the box)

□Contribute to scholarships related to UMW programs such as Mission u and seminar experiences.

□ Partner with a mission institution such as Harbor House, Northcott, or UM Children's Services of Wisconsin.

MABEL HEIL SCHOLARSHIP FUND......WISCONSIN CONFERENCE

Purpose: The Mabel Heil Scholarship is made possible by earnings from a trust established in the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a resident of Cuba City, Wisconsin. Funds are awarded by the Heil Scholarship

Committee of the Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women, and are invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation. Any Wisconsin United Methodist woman working to improve her education

may apply.

Available Funds:

- a. Funds will be invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, in a fund split 60% equity and 40% fixed.
- b. Funds available to provide scholarships for each semester will be calculated as 2.5% of the fair market value of the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund as of the end of the month prior to the approval of scholarships.

Eligibility Requirements:

a. Must be a female member of the United Woman in Faith and/or United Methodist Church, Wisconsin Conference

b. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what ways do I consider myself a worthy student?"

c. Letter of recommendation from either the president of the local UWF unit or from your pastor.

d. Letter of recommendation from a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative. (Person writing letter on behalf of applicant is to send the letter directly to the contact person.)

e. All letters must be written (preferably typed) on one side of an 8.5x11" sheet of white paper using black ink.

Application Procedure:

a. Awarded for one semester at a time. To be considered again for any subsequent semester, send a letter asking to be considered

b. Graduate students may apply for each semester as long as they meet the other requirements. c. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation OR RECONSIDERATION LETTER must be received by May 1 for the fall semester or October 1 for the spring semester. Checks will be disbursed by August 15 and January 15.

Honorable/Reverend Everett Mitchell (he/him) Judge Mitchell

is a Dane Co Circuit Court Judge and Senior Pastor of Christ the Solid Rock Baptist Church. He is a fierce advocate for education, social justice and equity. Judge Mitchell also oversees Dane County's Drug Court Program and is committed to dismantling the Child Welfare to Juvenile Delinquency to Adult Prison Pipeline operating not only in Wisconsin, but also around the country.

He is a sought after lecturer, has won many awards and serves on several Dane

County boards. As a trauma survivor himself, he has worked to change court policies to reflect trauma informed practices such as removing restraints and shackles from youth during hearings. Mitchell received a Bachelors Degree in mathematics and religious studies from Morehouse College in 2000, a Master of Divinity and Master of Theology from Princeton Theological Seminary, and a J.D. from the UW-Madison Law School. Mitchell was an assistant district attorney in <u>Dane County</u>. <u>Wisconsin</u>, from 2010 to 2012. From 2012 to 2016 Mitchell was the director of community relations at UW-Madison. He was elected to the <u>Dane County Circuit Court</u> in 2016 . Judge Mitchell and his wife have two children.



Peggy West-Schroder (she/her)

Ms. West-Schroder is the Executive Director for FREE. Directly and indirectly impacted, Peggy has been affected adversely by mass incarceration since birth, having been born while her mother was incarcerated in Taycheedah Correctional Facility (TCF). Raised in Foster Care and later adopted into a loving family, Peggy graduated from Milwaukee Area Technical College and has worked for the past 30 years in Human Services in addition to 14 years as an

elected member of the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (2002 – 2018) at which she made history as the first Hispanic Person ever elected to the board. Today Peggy is working to assure that incarcerated women across the State of WI are treated with dignity, that feel supported, and are provided trauma-informed care. Her goal is to change the process by which babies are born within DOC, righting the wrongs faced by her mother and many other women. Peggy and her husband live in Milwaukee and are the proud parents of 6 children and 6 grandchildren.
