I am Karen Leichtle, from River Falls, and I have been the North West District secretary for a little over a year. I'm not good at these "messages," but I thought it was about time I introduced myself. My husband and I have been Lutheran,

Presbyterian, UCC, Congregational as we moved around in earlier years. When we came to River Falls in 1991, the UMC had the best plan for our son(s). One of the UMW Circles, was an evening group, so for the first time I was able to participate in a women's group. I taught during the day back then.

About two months ago, a quote from our Sunday service hit me ... "Ritual does not super-cede action." It was a take on Jesus and the Pharisees. Showing up at church on Sunday and contributing to the offering isn't enough. United Women in Faith (UMW) has always worked this way—doing, helping, volunteering.

Today, I worry about how we can continue with this. Like many others, my church is struggling with how to cover everything with fewer workers. How can we build the UWF back up when there are other "worthy" groups? We have Ending Hunger Now, the Asylum Committee, Funeral Support, helping with Sunday School and Youth, community Christmas drive, Help for Creation, Free Saturday, Breakfast, our church's Food Pantry, the Local Gossip Committee (just kidding). And then there are Council, Trustees, Choirs—families and for many, jobs! I wish I had an answer. If you have ideas, please let me know—I will be overjoyed to pass your ideas along.

FAREWELL-- This is my last article for the Weaver. I joined the UMW Northwest District team in 2004 as a member of the Nominations

Committee. After four years, I became the Mission Coordinator for Education and Interpretation for four years. Tenure was up, but I could be historian, a job without tenure, so I kept that for the next nine years--2010-2018. Rita Stearns left rather suddenly, and I was asked to take her office--Mission Coordinator for Membership, Nurture and Outreach which I did for the next five years. These were the years when membership really declined. I understand that originally there were 93 units, in 2004 there were 63 units when I joined, and by 2023 we now have 29 units. I am now back to Education & Interpretation for one term.

It has been a rewarding experience working with so many talented and dedicated women. We have had so many excellent SDOE and Annual Meeting speakers with attendance of around 150 to a dwindling number of 80 or less in recent years. The reality is everyone has gotten older and passed, and the younger women have not joined the organization. We are not alone; this is happening in other denominations too. Let's pray that we find a turnaround in the future.

MISSION TODAY REPORT FORM – Tasks for 2022

Becoming a Mission Today UMW means that you have completed two (2) tasks from each criterion: Faith, Hope, Love, and Action. Think outside the box; there may be things you did this year that fit the criteria. The box following each criterion allows you to explain something that you feel fit the criteria you find on the other side of this form. The challenge each year is to try at least 1 new criterion during the year.

FAITH – United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose PURPOSE is to know God Plan programs that encourage spiritual growth. (occasionally used Program book or <i>response</i> magazine) Create prayer partners with other church groups. (Prayer chains, World Day of Prayer, etc.) Pray using the Prayer Calendar at meetings. Organize the spiritual growth study from Mission u, possibly several evenings/weeks.
HOPE – to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; Take advantage of opportunities through UMW. (Mission u, Spiritual Growth Retreats, Annual Gatherings, Mission Action Day) Set aside a time to go over the year's plans using Mission Today Mission Tasks. Implement the Charter for Racial Justice. Present a mission study from Mission u, inviting church members.
LOVE – to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; Honor the organization's leaders and member's contributions with Special Mission Recognition pins. Encourage everyone to visit or invite visitors to/from other local UMW organizations. Publicize your events using newsletters, bulletin boards, Sunday bulletins, social media, phone calls, etc. Plan a year-end program to give thanks and celebrate your accomplishments. Plan visits to former members or friends of UMW who are unable to attend due to illness or residing in rest homes, etc.
ACTION – and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church. □ Encourage all members to participate in the Pledge for Mission; give reports of where the money goes. □ Involve all members in fundraising (think outside the box) □ Contribute to scholarships related to UMW programs such as Mission u and seminar experiences. □ Partner with a mission institution such as Harbor House, Northcott, or UM Children's Services of Wisconsin.
