#### President's Message

Happy Birthday United Methodist Women! We are 150 years young and ready to plan to continue to build up the kin(g)-dom of God for another 150 years and beyond. I have just returned from leading the "Women United for Change: 150 Years in Mission" study at Mission u and I am energized by the history, passion and transformative mission for which our foremothers worked and persisted so tirelessly. Women used what they had and never let "no" be the final answer. They heard the needs of women and girls from far and near and answered that call by giving of their time, their talent and their resources. Women have been leaders and forerunners of the church on many issues – education for girls, maternal health, anti-lynching campaigns, racial desegregation, inclusion of LGBQ+ persons, accommodations for persons with disabilities, economic equality and so much more. We continue to be change-makers and world-transformers in the model of Christ today.

We will be continuing to celebrate and uplift our mission story at our District Annual Gathering on September 21<sup>st</sup> at Platteville where the women of the Stitzer UMW unit will give us a view of our historic beginnings complete with costumes! Judy Vasby and I will be presenting more stories of women in mission from our history at the Conference Annual Gathering on October 18-19 at Black River Falls. There is so much history to learn and celebrate as we look to the past to inspire and excite us about our future. I hope you will be attending at least one of these events and bring your friends. For those units who did not send someone to last year's District Annual Gathering, you were sent a coupon which is good for one free attendee for this year's District Annual Gathering. We hope to make our goal of having at least one person from every unit attend our District Annual Gathering. You will be glad you came! Many times, our foremothers were told they could not do something and they made mission happen anyway. When Lizzie Hoffman was refused as a missionary because she was a single woman, she organized mission societies to send other women in her place. When Mary McLeod Bethune was told she could never raise the money to open a school for African-American girls in Florida in one week, she baked sweet potato pies and sold them and her school opened on time. Even when our predecessor organizations were subsumed by maledominated boards of mission and our connection to our programs and National Mission institutions were blocked, women found a way to reconnect and

I am writing this on a quiet Sunday afternoon; after our great Wisconsin Heat Wave. I hope you all are enjoying the respite from the heat and rain.

I have been praying for resolution along the border with Mexico. I would like to point you to the July/August issue of Response Magazine Bible Study "Love the Immigrant as yourself". In looking back at past Action items in Social Justice, I found that this has been an issue since 2012. That was 7 years ago; and I was wondering what has been happening since?

Imagine, Carol Barton, UMW Executive for Community Action; attending our Mission U 2019! I had the opportunity to have lunch with her on Friday, Overview Day (and all our Sisters at the table). Carol had been to the border in the Spring and was able to enter a prison, with an immigration lawyer. She said the conditions are worse than we are hearing and seeing. One Highlight was the churches down there are making travel backpacks for the immigrants being bussed. The immigrants have no possessions of their own. Some backpacks might be for children; a change of clothing, a small toy etc. Adults got a change of clothing, toothbrush & toothpaste, soap. These bags were meant to get them through 3 days of travel. Sadly, many traveled as much as 5 days to get to the next detention facility. Only, the immigrants who are leaving the border prisons get these things. No help is reaching those in the border prisons. What can we do? <a href="https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/immigration">https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/immigration</a> will give us several options.

Now is the time to get educated. "Interrupting the school-to-prison Pipeline". Beginning Monday, August 19, are several classes aimed at educating and understanding the school-to prison pipeline.

This first <u>Webinar</u> is *The reality of it all: Injustice of our Education System*. Two UMW High School Summer Interns will share their real challenges that students and teachers face. This and 5 more can be found at umw.convio.net.



"I thought Priscilla had an informative program today," Diane commented as they walked toward the parking lot.


"Yes, I enjoy the way she presents the Charter for Racial Justice. My, it must take the committee months to pull all of the information together," added Jane.
