

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings,

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!  $\sim 2$  Corinthians 5:17 (NIV)

As I look out my window today, these words surely ring true. Daffodils are blooming, and grass is greening where a blanket of snow lay just a few days ago! As I read Paul's words, I find myself wondering, as the people of the congregation in Corinth must have, "What newness am I about to see? What will that newness look like, and what will it mean for me, for my congregation, for our conference, our denomination?"

When I wrote my article for our previous newsletter, the Special General Conference hadn't yet met, the vote on language in the Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality hadn't yet taken place. As you probably know by now, the provision that passed (known as the Traditionalist Plan) left the current statements about homosexuality, samesex marriage, and the ordination of LGBTQ+ persons fundamentally unchanged, while strengthening the sanctions against clergy who violate the statements.

For about one-third of U.S. delegates, that is the outcome they'd hoped for. Others might not be entirely pleased with the outcome, but intend to follow the Book of Discipline. Many others have been moved to action, no longer willing to endure the back-and-forth debates about the language in the B.o.D. every quadrennial at General Conference. Conferences have written open letters to their bishops, congregations are updating their mission statements, laity and clergy from around the U.S. are meeting to determine next steps. It is much too early to know what this all will mean for the United Methodist denomination, but it seems clear that "a new creation is coming."

As for United Methodist Women, we will continue to follow our Purpose: to be a community of women, to know God, to develop creative and supportive fellowship, and to expand concepts of mission including spiritual growth, leadership development, transformative education, and working for justice through service and advocacy.

This year's Mission u spiritual growth study is "Practicing Resurrection: The Gospel of Mark and Radical Discipleship", with a focus on the radical women in the book of Mark. As United Methodist Women have for the last 150 years, now is a time for us to be like those bold women who faithfully followed Jesus.





### **Instructions:**

- 1. Be a female member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women.
- 2. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what ways do I consider myself a worthy student?"
- 3. Send a completed application to the contact person by May 1 or October 1.
- 4. Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by either the president of the local UMW or by a pastor of the church.
- 5. Request that a letter of recommendation be sent to the contact person by a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative.

### **Rules:**

- A. Any member of Wisconsin Conference United Methodist Women working to improve her education may apply.
- B. All letters must be written (preferably typed) on one side of an 8 1/2 X 11 sheet of white paper, using black ink.
- C. All applications are photocopied for the committee members.
- D. Scholarships are awarded one semester at a time. To be considered again DURING a one-year period, you must send a letter asking to be considered. AFTER one year, you will need to fill out another form and secure new recommendations.
- E. If, in any given year, there is an increase of applications, these priorities will be followed: Women responsible for others will be favored. Women preparing to return to the employment field will be favored.
- F. The schedule is: **First semester** Apply by May 1, Notified by June 1, Check given August 15. **Second semester** Apply by October 1, Notified by November 1, Check given by December 1.
- G. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation MUST be postmarked no later than May 1 and October 1 to be considered.
